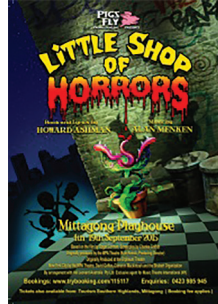

Pigs Fly Productions presented the Little Shop of Horrors comedy horror rock musical at the Mittagong Playhouse on September 4th, 2015 and 5 members of the Hume Coal staff were lucky enough to attend the opening night.

Little Shop of Horrors is a comedy horror rock musical, about a hapless florist shop worker who raises a plant that feeds on human blood and flesh. The musical is based on the low-budget 1960 black comedy film The Little Shop of Horrors, directed by Roger Corman.

We all had a fabulous night and best of all the proceeds from the opening night were donated to Challenge Southern Highlands, a very worthwhile community based charitable organisation which incorporates the Welby Garden Centre, a Light Packing Division and a Secure Document Destruction. They provide training and employment opportunities for people with disabilities.
